1. BACKGROUND TO CATHSSETA

The Skills Development Act (No 97 of 1998) (SDA) makes provision for the establishment of Sector Education and Training Authorities (SETAs) for each national economic sector and thereby aims to develop the skills of the South African workforce by increasing the investment in education and training in the labour market; and encouraging employers to play a meaningful role in developing employees, particularly the previously disadvantaged. The Culture, Arts, Tourism, Hospitality and Sport Sector Education and Training Authority (CATHSSETA) was established through the SDA, to research and establish nationally recognised Sector Skills Plan (SPP) supported by skills development programmes serving the interest of the following sectors:

- Culture, Arts and Heritage
- Tourism and Travel Services
- Hospitality
- Gaming and Lotteries
- Conservation; and
- Sport, Recreation and Fitness

These sectors are diverse and unique and they play a significant role not only in the economy, but also in the broader quest for social cohesion and formulation of a unique South African national identity.

CATHSSETA's critical success factors are described as the key processes that deliver services to the CATHSSETA beneficiaries, i.e. learners and employers. The process is based on the three critical components of the CATHSSETA service delivery Value Chain:

- Facilitation of Learning Interventions. Involves facilitation of all skills development initiatives
- Quality Assurance of Skills Development. Involves accreditation of skills development facilitators, verification of learners, and development of occupational qualifications
- Employer engagements. Involves the receipt of levies and payments of grants.

The importance of the three areas are the points of integration between them.

2. SCOPE OF THE PROJECT

There is a recognized need for specialized service provider/ firm to assist the CATHSSETA with the provision of Grant funding management service-

CATHSSETA hereby invites suitably qualified and experienced service providers/firms to submit RFQ proposals for the provision of Grant funding management service. A panel of service providers who are independent from the CATHSSETA to provide Learning Programme and Grant funding management for a period of 12 months on the following:

1. Evaluate Mandatory Grant, Discretionary grants and Strategic Projects applications;
2. Conduct Workplace Validation and Site visits;
3. Manage Industry funded learning programmes administration and reporting; and

The independent service provider must recognise and embrace the principles of transparency, openness, equity, access and fairness in the allocation and disbursement of Grants and learning programmes administration without prejudice to any stakeholder.

The appointed service providers will assist applicants with the application process and compilation of all relevant documents in support of application for funding and ancillary functions to prospective applicants as follows:

A. Evaluation of applications for Mandatory Grant, Discretionary Grants and Strategic Projects:

The SETA Grant Regulations requires SETAS to allocate Mandatory Grant to levy paying employers that has met certain criteria and requirements set by a SETA". The regulations further allow for SETAs to prepare and distribute grant application and project proposal forms in a manner that enables opportunities for a legal person or enterprise of different sizes (including small and micro enterprise, NGOs and Cooperatives in sector to apply for Discretionary Grants to benefit.

To ensure compliance with the Grant regulation, CATHSSETA evaluates Mandatory Grant, Discretionary Grants and Strategic Projects to ensure that implementation runs smoothly with no complications.

Compliance checks and evaluation will be done through an online system in order to increase efficiency. There are at least 3 windows (1x window for Mandatory, 1x windows for Discretionary Grants (including remedial window for targets not reached where applicable) and 1x Strategic Projects of which are manual submission) that will be opened per annum. An estimate number of 3000 for Mandatory Grant, Discretionary Grant and Strategic Projects applications are received from all provinces. Evaluation process will include but not limited to the below:

1. Evaluate applications for PIVOTAL programmes and NON-PIVOTAL in line with approved criteria and the approved Mandatory Grant, Discretionary Grants and Strategic Projects Policies;
2. Evaluate Remedial windows that emanate from either of the above mentioned Grants
3. Maintain a clear and unambiguous record of evaluation proceedings;
4. The scope for evaluations of mandatory grants include actual evaluation of all submissions/ applications, review of request for extensions, appeals as well as conducting site visits in compliance with policy requirements
5. Conduct workplace validation and site visits for Mandatory Grant, Discretionary Grant and Strategic Projects and produce reports for each case; and
6. Compile and submit evaluation reports with recommendations and support processes for consideration and decision-making purposes by relevant structures within CATHSSETA

B. Support the Administration of Industry Funded Learning Projects

NSDP puts emphasis on the need to train employed workers to improve the overall productivity of the economy and address skills imbalances. CATHSSETA as a training authority for its specific sub sectors manages the registration and document management of industry funded learning programmes and projects. Industry funded learning programmes and projects are learnership and skills programmes that are being implemented and funded by the industry and not CATHSSETA. Employers and training providers declare interest to provide their employees with learnerships and skills programmes on quarterly basis nationally. This process requires CATHSSETA to manage the registration process and ensure that documents are filed and achieved for certification and audit purposes. Duties aligned to management of industry funded learning programmes include:

1. On entry of all industry funded learners, conduct workplace validation visits to training providers and collect all information for industry funded;
2. Validate performance information before reporting of learning either on entry and completion of both industry and seta funded learners;

3. Support and assist the CATHSSETA in conducting induction, M&E and site visits, liaise with the service providers and employers for continuous feedback and information dissemination;
4. Register learners on the CATHSSETA management system upon receiving prescribed documentation (signed learner agreements, recently certified ID copies, CV and certificates or statement of results) in line with the DHET validation guidelines of performance information;
5. Manage CATHSSETA Quarterly Monitoring Report (SETMIS), upload and conduct monthly QMR audit;
6. Submit all project files onto the central filing system and archive all project data;
7. Compile and submit monthly progress reports including recommendations for each project attended to every month;
8. Manage printing of certificates and ensure that they are disseminated to the employers and training providers; and
9. Manage stakeholder relations

A detailed project proposal and implementation plan must include all activities and show all work breakdown, costing and timelines:

1. Project proposal should demonstrate the bidder’s understanding of the Skills Development fraternity, the Learning Programme and Grant funding management processes and reporting periods;
2. Project Implementation methodology and approach;
3. Proposed project implementation, progress reports and close-out reporting; and
4. Project risks and constraints with mitigation strategies

8. PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEM

The RFQ will be evaluated on the 80/20 (Price and BBBEE points) preference point system in terms of the PPPFA Act and its regulations 2017. The contract will be awarded to the service provider that scored the highest total number of points. All Responses that achieve the minimum qualifying score **70** for functionality, will be evaluated further in terms of the price and preference point system as follows
