Questions	CATHSSETA Response
1. How many qualifications that require re-alignment?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ±50, however consultative sessions will be held with the industry before contracting, to determine the exact number of qualifications.
2. Was due diligence for the realignment conducted?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • QCTO model has been utilized, the historically registered qualifications that will be identified by the industry during consultative session, will be considered in the realignment process.
3. Is it possible to peruse the SLA template that the CATHSSETA & QDF will enter into?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CATHSSETA has a standard template for contracts which are amended accordingly to suit specific projects and approved by the legal team.
4. Who will cover the expenses of undertaking the facilitation of the public comments?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The coordination of the public comment will be undertaken by the QDF, hand in hand with the appointed service provider, therefore the CATHSSETA will encompass all the expenses.
5. What is the difference between new and old qualifications?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Legacy qualifications (old) are composed of a number of separate unit standards, each catering for the achievement of practical competencies (outcomes) theoretical knowledge (essential embedded knowledge) and critical cross-field outcomes. <p>QCTO qualifications (new) split the legacy unit standards into three separate unit standards per unit of learning (module or subject), one providing for knowledge, one for practical skills and one for work experience.</p>
